

JOB TITLE: A&P AIRPLANE MECHANIC

We accomplish this through our three program areas, the Medical Relief & Air Transport (MAT) Program, our Global Programs, and our SOAR into STEM (SiS) educational programs.

SUMMARY

Wings of Hope seeks an A&P (Airframe and Powerplant) mechanic to join our team. This position is responsible for the maintenance, inspection, and repair of Wings of Hope's fleet of aircraft systems and components. Key duties include conducting routine servicing, airworthiness directives "AD" compliance checks, diagnosing issues, performing repairs on engines and airframes, and ensuring compliance with safety regulations and standards set by the FAA.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Key responsibilities include:

- Inspection: Conduct thorough inspections of aircraft systems, structures, and components to ensure they meet safety and regulatory standards.
- Maintenance: Perform routine and scheduled maintenance on aircraft, including servicing engines, fuselage, electrical systems, and landing gear.
- Repairs: Diagnose and repair mechanical, electrical, and structural issues using hand tools, power tools, and specialized equipment.
- Compliance: Ensure adherence to federal aviation regulations (FARs) and policies of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), including record-keeping and documentation of all maintenance actions.
- Testing: Conduct functional testing and troubleshooting to verify the proper operation of aircraft systems and components post-maintenance.
- Modifications: Install and modify aircraft systems and parts, ensuring they are integrated properly and function as intended.
- Safety Practices: Maintain a safe working environment by following safety procedures and protocols, including using personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Collaboration: Work closely with other maintenance team members and volunteers to ensure the efficient completion of maintenance tasks.
- Training and Development: Stay updated on the latest aircraft technologies, maintenance procedures, and regulations through continuous education and training.
